H.E. Dr. Mohammad Javed Patwary, BPM (Bar) assumed the charge of Ambassador of Bangladesh to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia on 22 August 2020. Prior to this Ambassadorial assignment, he retired as the Inspector General of Police (IGP) of Bangladesh. He served in Bangladesh Police for 35 (thirty-five) years with dignity and competency.

He graduated from the University of Dhaka with Bachelor's and Masters' degree in Social Welfare. He also earned his Post Graduate Certificate in "Criminal Justice and Police Management" from the University of Leicester, UK and a Ph.D. on "Combating Terrorism in Bangladesh: Challenges and Prospects" from Jahangirnagar University, Dhaka.
